Overview and Rationale

Students will work together to research about an historical person located in the Library of Congress, and eventually translate that information into a poem that will be published on Wordle. Students will learn collaborative, technological, and poetry skills that will be useful to their education and future.

Objectives

- Students will be able to research a topic that interests them inside the Library of Congress website.
- Students will be able to use poetic strategies to create a BioPoem about a researched topic.
- Students will create a visual display of a poem on wordle.com.

Materials

- A computer for each student.
- An example of a BioPoem for students to look at.

Procedure

- 1. Students will log onto the Library of Congress website. (loc.org).
- 2. Students will research one person that interests them.
- 3. Students will create a BioPoem based on the research they find.

The format students will use for the BioPoem is as follows:

- 1. Line 1-Write the first name of the famous person
- 2. Line 2-Three or four words that describe the famous person
- 3. Line 3-Where was the famous person born?
- 4. Line 4-Describe the time period in which he or she lived.
- 5. Line 5-Name a family member and their relationship to the famous person.
- 6. Line 6-How is this famous person best known in history?
- 7. Line 7-Name three things the famous person tried to accomplish.
- 8. Line 8-Name three important accomplishments.
- 9. Line 9-Write the last name of the famous person.
- 4. Students will display their poem on a Wordle using wordle.com

Assessment

Students will be assessed on the following criteria:

- Effectively use a BioPoem as a writing strategy to convey information
- Research conducted on an individual or event using the LOC website
- Creatively using wordle to visually display their BioPoem
- Displaying their wordle in the classroom for other students to enjoy
