Overview and rationale

Students learn how to use the Library of Congress webpage, find primary resources, and identify important facts.

Objectives

Students will research an historical figure.

Students will be able to create a BioPoem.

Students will be able to create a Wordle.

Students will be able to navigate the Library of Congress webpage.

Procedure

1. Explain to students that they are going to choose an historical figure, research that person, create a BioPoem, and create a Wordle.

- 2. Show students an example of a BioPoem and a Wordle.
- 3. Demonstrate for the students how to navigate the Library of Congress webpage.
- 4. Using the information just found as a class, create a BioPoem and Wordle together.
- 5. Give students time to work on the assigned tasks.
- 6. Once finished give each student time to present their poems.

Assessment

Students will be assessed on the completion of their biopoem, with correct factual information and completion of their Wordle.
