Life in the Dust Bowl: Journal Writing

Grade level: 5th grade

Objective: Students will be able to research information on the Dust Bowl. They will write a journal entry acting as if they were a person who was part of the Dust Bowl and going through similar experiences that people went through at that time. Students will be able to write and illustrate their own hypothetical experiences going through the Dust Bowl that are inspired from their research.

- 4. When the students are finished with their entry, they will go back with their partner and revise any mistakes.
- 5. The students will rewrite their entries, and then turn in their final copy to the teacher.
