Quiltmaking: Sound Recording Analysis & Wordle Creation

Include multimedia components and visual displays in presentations to clarify claims and findings and emphasize salient points.

Objectives:

Students will be able to analyze a sound recording of their choice using multimedia components

Students will be able to create a visual display relating to the meaning of the sound clip

Students will be able to summarize the sound clip and explain it to the class

Materials:

- 1. Computer lab (one computer per 2 students)
- 2. Worksheet with questions (1 per student) Library of Congress Sound Recording Analysis http://www.loc.gov/teachers/usingprimarysources/resources/Analyzing_Sound_Recordings.pdf
- 3. Quiltmakers' Recordings in the Library of Congress http://www.loc.gov/search/?q=Quiltmaking+in+America&sp=7
- 4. Wordle-http://www.wordle.net

Procedures:

- 1. Guide students through the library of congress website so that they can choose a sound recording to listen to
- 2. Students will pick a sound recording of their choice
- 3. Once students have found a sound recording, give them worksheet to fill out with their partner
- 4. Allow students time to complete worksheet
- 5. once worksheet is completed, walk the class through how to create a Wordle

- 6. show class the example Wordle made by teacher
- 7. students will create Wordle based on words from their audio clip
- 8. students will finish and print Wordle
- 9. groups will present their Wordle to the class along with a brief summary of the sound clip that they listened to

Assessment:

Worksheet will include these questions:

- 1. What is the title of the sound clip?
- 2. What is the setting of the clip? (location, time period, weather, time of day)
- 3. List 3 main points of interest from the clip (you will need to be able to summarize the clip to the class so take good notes for yourselves!)
- 4. Make a list of 10-15 key words that will be put in to a Wordle

Students will be assessed by the completion of this worksheet, the Wordle, and the presentation of the clip/Wordle.
