Researching the United States of America

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Lesson Plan

Overview:

Each student will use technology to access information regarding a state in the United States. They will read individually and gather key facts that they will later share with a group of their classmates.

Grade Level: 4th/5th

Objectives:

Each student will use technology to acquire important information regarding a state in the US. They will create a short summary that highlights the facts that are important about their state. Students then share their summary with a group of other students in the class.

Rationale:

Using the Library of Congress website as a resource provides students with the opportunity to work with technology. Students will get practice in research methodologies, gaining the knowledge that print comes from a variety of sources and serves a variety of functions. Finally, sharing the data gathered with other students will reinforce the knowledge and enhance communication skills.

- Paper for students to keep notes/print notes

Procedure:

1. Introduce students to the *Library of Congress* website and model how they will find their information

- 2. Assign each student a state to research
- 3. Provide each student access to a computer to do their research
- 4. Provide the web address http://www.americaslibrary.gov/cgi-bin/page.cgi/es and help students get to the website
- 5. Students click on assigned state and individually read the information provided about the state
- 6. Students take notes with key information about their state
- 7. Once all students have information, place into small groups for discussion
- 8. In small groups, students share the information that they researched about their state

Assessment:

- (Informal) Observation of students during sharing time in small groups
 - Teacher assesses for:
 - Communication skills
 - Teamwork
 - Participation
- (Formal) Students hand in notes with key information
 - Teacher assesses for:
 - Quality of information
 - Thoroughness of information
 - Summary skills
