Thomas Edison: Comparison of Book and Website Facts

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Grade level: 3rd grade

Subject: Social Studies

Standards:

• IL-ISBE-ELA-CC-2010.K-12.W.R.1 Text Types and Purposes: Write arguments to support claims in an analysis of substantive topics or texts, using valid reasoning and relevant and sufficient evidence.

Rationale: The purpose of this lesson is to teach students to compare and contrast biographies of important people in our history, while gaining a better understanding of their contribution to today's society.

Objective: Students will be able to compare and contrast two biographies of Thomas Edison.

Lesson Duration: 60 minutes

Assignment: Research Thomas Edison in the Library of Congress site www.loc.gov and make a Venn Diagram comparing the information learned from the book and website.

Procedure:

- 1. Read A Wizard from the Start by: Don Brown to the class
- 2. Discuss the key parts of the story
- 3. Move class into the computer lab
- 4. Log onto www.loc.gov
- 5. Have them research Thomas Edison
- 6. Hand out the Venn Diagram Work sheet
- 7. Have the students fill out the Venn diagram, comparing and contrasting the information they learned from the book, and the information they learn online.

Materials:

- 1. A Wizard from the Start by: Don Brown
- 2. Computers for each child to use
- 3. Venn Diagram worksheet

Assessment:

Students will complete the Venn diagram and will be graded based on the following rubric:
