Overview and Rationale

Students will be asked to choose a President's picture. They will then be instructed to answer the questions modeled to them previously. Students need to know this information about the President in order to understand the decisions they made when in office.

Objectives

Students will select a president of the United States of American and identify important facts.

Students will make inferences about the picture of their president.

Students will be able to share their picture and the information with the class.

Procedure

 - 1. Instruct students to look at your projected screen (demonstration)
 - 2. Tell students they are going to look at a picture from the Library of Congress and answer some questions
 - 3. Show the picture, give no explanation of it.
 - 4. Ask the students the following visual literacy questions: What do you see? What is happening? What items are displayed? Describe items. What did you see first? Why are they included? Any cultural differences? Time period? What do you feel when you look at this photo?
 - 5. Then ask students to record this information into their notebooks
 - 6. Ask students to answer, Does this picture tell a story? Is this an important picture? Why is this picture important? Summarize what you see.
 - 7. Instruct students to record the answers in their notebooks
 - 8. Then tell students they are going to find a picture of a United States President
 - 9. They need to answer the visual literacy questions and find out about the photograph

- 10. Give the students the Library of Congress website www.loc.gov
- 11. Instruct them to find a picture of one of our presidents
- 12. Students will create a poster board using the picture
- 13. Tell students to prepare a short presentation about their picture answering the visual literacy questions and using the information they found in the Library of Congress
- 14. Students will break into small groups and share their presentations
